


This is the set up I used on the cruise:

During the day, I took pictures with the cellphone.


OneDrive automatically backed up the photos whenever I was connected to Wi-Fi

In the evenings, I used a laptop to edit photos, saving results to OneDrive. I posted a few photos to Facebook and emailed or texted a few to friends who do not use Facebook.

I also used Wi-Fi calling on the ship so that phone calls did not trigger roaming charges.




Every time the ship moved to a new country, I got a text message from T-Mobile about roaming charges



By default OneDrive puts all photos in the Pictures\Camera Roll folder.


To help you find photos later, I recommend you create folders within the Camera Roll folder:






Double-click a photo to open Editor View
