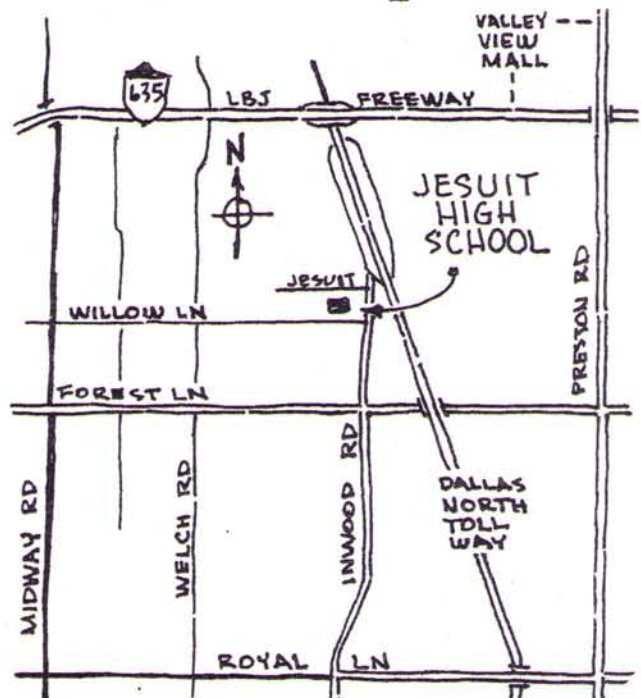

Using Published Programs - A Clarification

In a letter to Softalk magazine by Charles Walker, Elm Grove LA, Charles requested permission to copy programs from Softalk for distribution to members of Northwest Louisiana IBM User Group. The editor wrote:

"Thanks for giving us the opportunity to clarify. We emphatically encourage you to copy programs published in Softalk. You may also print them in user group newsletters and list them on nonprofit bulletin boards. We'd like for them to reach as many people as possible. Technically, Softalk holds a copyright on everything published in Softalk. What this means in practical terms is that we'd take issue with anyone who chose to sell a program that we'd published, or print it, without our permission, in a book or a competing magazine. Apart from these limitations, please make free with our material in any way you wish."

This is a great attitude, one that could easily be shared by other magazines. It certainly represents our attitude toward material published in PC NEWS. The only thing I would add is, where practical, proper credit should be given to the author and the publication.

Beginning with this issue of PC NEWS our Group will begin exchanging newsletters with other IBM PC User Groups around the country. Tom Prickett volunteered to coordinate this effort. He will have his hands full; there are over a hundred groups listed in current magazines and the number is growing rapidly. Thanks, Tom, for taking on this added chore.

DISK OF THE MONTH

NOVEMBER HIGHLIGHTS GAMES RETURN! 747.BAS

A flight simulator program with visual display. Officially named the Jet Simulator Electronic Trainer (JETSET), this interpreted basic program won BYTE Magazine's game contest and an extensive writeup in the November 1982 issue. The program lets the pilot activate the control surfaces of the jet aircraft, adjust engine thrust, and tune navigational radio equipment. 747 continues until the jet lands and rolls safely to a halt or the flight ends in disaster.

Flying lessons include taking off, maneuvering, navigating, practicing VOR navigation, and practicing instrument landings. JETSET author Eugene Szymanski of Princeton, NJ designed it to be "technically sound and complex enough to require a certain amount of skill and judgment at the keyboard." Includes brief instructions in a .DOC file, but access to the complete description in the Nov. 82 BYTE issue significantly enhances the game for unlicensed pilots. (Note: instead of < and >, the comma and period are actually used by the program for aircraft rudder control.)


